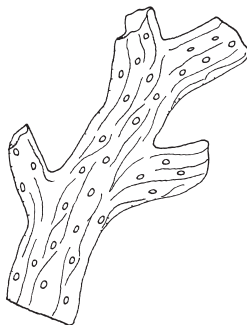


Bryozoans

How: They are sedentary and don't move around

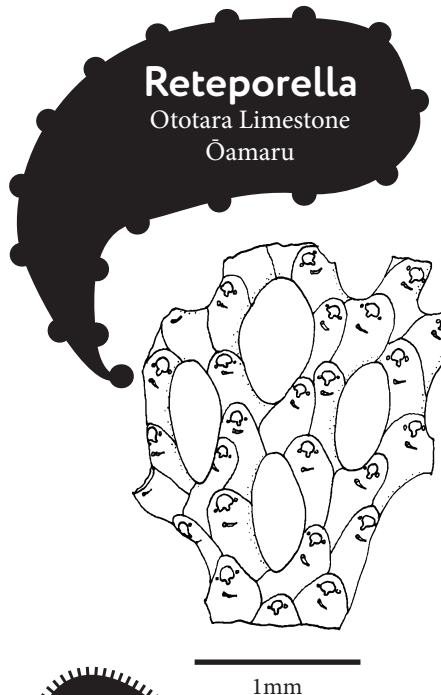
Where: Live in water in colony groups

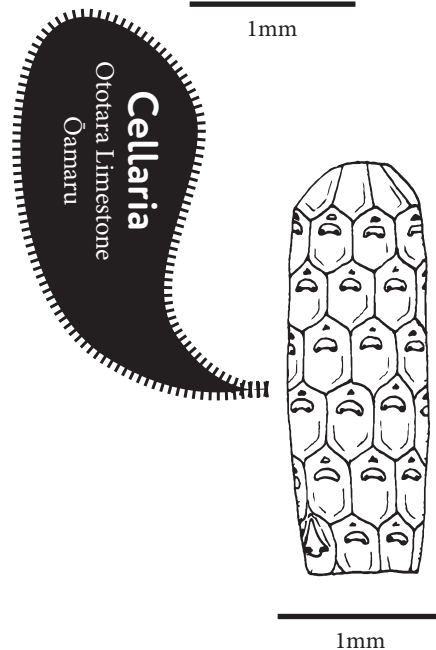

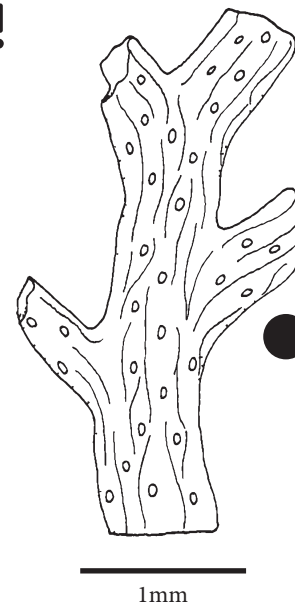
Cellaria

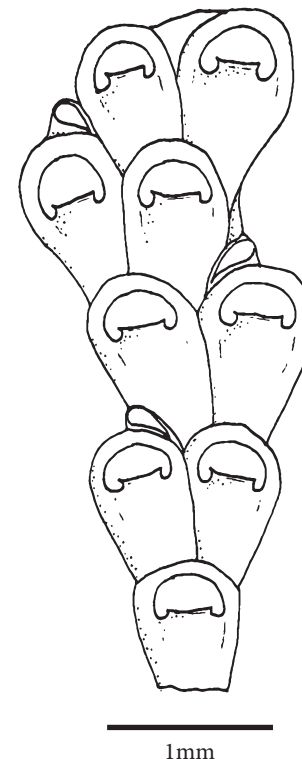
Hornera
